Pastor's Corner

Psalm 138

I give You thanks, O LORD, with my whole heart;

before the gods I sing Your praise;

I bow down toward Your holy temple,

and give thanks to Your name for Your steadfast love and your faithfulness.

for You have exalted above all things

Your name and Your Word.

On the day I called, You answered me;

my strength of soul You increased.

All the kings of the earth shall give You thanks, O LORD,

for they have heard the words of Your mouth,

and they shall sing of the ways of the LORD, for great is the glory of the LORD.

For though the LORD is high, He regards the lowly,

but the haughty He knows from afar.

Though I walk in the midst of trouble, You preserve my life;

You stretch out Your hand against the wrath of my enemies,

and Your right hand delivers me.

The LORD will fulfill His purpose for me;

Your steadfast love, O LORD, endures forever.

Do not forsake the work of Your hands.

We find ourselves "in the midst of trouble" as Thanksgiving approaches, and our prayers for a speedy and just end to war-torn areas in our world have been met with the consistent "wait" answer. Under the stress of problems and politics, we are hard pressed to find things to be thankful for. But this psalmist still was thankful: thankful that his life was spared, that the strength of his life increased, that God's Name and God's Word are exalted, and even the kings of the earth will bring their thanksgiving to God. Why? Because in times of trouble, we have to face this truth: we are not in control. Wealth, power, status, none of these are of much use in the face of problems that are looming so large that we feel helpless. Yet it is God Who is in control, Who looks on the lowly with favor, Who saves our lives and builds us up spiritually, even in times of violence and unrest. We, who know God, have the inside track, that eventually even political rulers will realize: they must turn to God for help. And when God delivers us, even kings and presidents and prime ministers and senators and congressmen and judges will join us in thanksgiving and praise; they will see the undeniable evidence that God's Word is true, and that God's ways are right. Believers will be leading the song that everyone will take up, because of God's steadfast love and faithfulness.

In the meantime, with the psalmist, be assured that God will fulfill His purpose for us, and will not desert us, for we are the work of His hands. So start now, thank God with your whole heart, sing God's praise for His steadfast love and faithfulness, and know that His eye is on you for blessing. Eventually even the politicians will catch on.
