#### **Pastor's Corner**

A Night of Watching

It was a night of watching by the LORD, to bring them out of the land of Egypt; so this night is a night of watching kept to the LORD by all the people of Israel throughout their generations. Exodus 12:42

2024 is upon us, and most of us have plans for New Year's Eve. It may involve family, or friends, a party, or a fancy ball at some special venue. Toasting the new year, singing "Auld Lang Syne" – which is from the Scots language and means "old long since" or "for old time's sake" (yes, I had to look it up) – and we watch as the New Year rolls in. Young kids want to stay up to see the ball drop in Times Square, us oldsters may kiss our spouses and go to bed early murmuring, "Happy new year, honey." But for the Israelites, the eve of their departure from Egypt, from slavery, was a night of watching by the LORD, and a spiritual discipline of watching kept to the LORD kept for all generations to come.

The people of Israel are our spiritual ancestors, and Passover is their identity feast. It marks the beginning of a new life of freedom, of a new calendar. They eat lamb, and unleavened bread, and bitter herbs to commemorate their hasty departure from Egypt, all packed, dressed for travel, eating in a posture of readiness. Exodus 11 & 12 not only tell us the story of the escape from Egypt, but institute this feast as a perpetual reminder of God's glorious deliverance, and how the LORD watched over them the whole night.

Christ's Incarnation – Christmas – is celebrated at the turning of the year for 12 days, overlapping New Year's. Our anno domini calendar, A.D., means "in the year of our Lord." Our Eucharist – communion – is our identity feast. Instituted by the Lord Jesus at the time of the Passover, His body, His blood, represented in the bread and cup, are our memorial feast of Christ's death and resurrection. 1 Corinthians 5:7,8 says, "For Christ our Passover Lamb has been sacrificed for us, therefore let us keep the festival." The Lord Jesus also spent a night in watchful prayer for Himself and us before His Passion.

This New Year's Eve, let's make time to keep watch to the LORD, to start 2024 with worship and prayer. Celebrating our great deliverance from sin and death, let's face the new year with a posture of readiness for all that the LORD has for us, our LORD Who still watches over us.

## Recipe of the Month Oatmeal Cranberry-Raisin Cookies

1 cup butter, softened	2 cups all purpose flour
1 cup packed brown sugar	1 tsp. baking soda
1 cup white sugar	1 tsp. baking powder

2 eggs 1 tsp. salt

1 tsp. vanilla extract 1 cup dried cranberries

2 cups quick cooking oats 1 cup raisins

Beat butter, brown sugar, white sugar, eggs and vanilla for 5 minutes. In another bowl, combine oats, flour, baking soda, baking powder and salt. Add to butter mixture 1 cup at a time. Mix in raisins and cranberries. Form into rolls, 1 to 1 1/2 around. Wrap in waxed paper or foil. Chill thoroughly or freeze until ready to bake. With a sharp knife, slice cookies in about 1/4 inch thick. Bake on ungreased cookie sheet about 10 minutes or until light brown in 350 degree oven. Keep a roll of cookie dough in your fridge for unexpected guests. Makes about 5 dozen. Enjoy!
