

Pastor's Corner

Fear does terrible things to people. When people came to the tomb early on that first Resurrection Sunday, and they saw that the body of the Lord Jesus Christ was gone, they also saw angels who told them that Jesus had risen from the dead, and they were, most naturally, afraid. But the angels tell them not to be afraid. The angels know what these first seekers were after, they are looking for Jesus. But they were looking for a dead Jesus, not a live, risen, Savior. The message is simple: God has brought joy out of sorrow, life out of death, immortal, indestructible, glorious power out of the Incarnation. The Lord they followed in His mortal lifetime is now their alive-again King already reigning in eternity. And during those next precious 40 days on earth the Lord Jesus would appear to more than five hundred people, and many would see extraordinary miracles.

Sometimes we get so focused on the immediate problem that we cannot see the glory. Sometimes we are so drawn into our fear that we do not give God the trust He deserves. After all, the Lord Jesus proved Himself over and over to His followers during His lifetime with extraordinary teaching, with signs and miracles, and told them – multiple times - that He would die and rise again, and yet they still are looking in an empty tomb on Sunday morning. Fear brought them to the tomb. Fear made them think the devil could win. Fear made them look for the living among the dead.

Challenging times in our lives, in our world, and we are tempted to fear, to think this crisis or that problem will never end, to rush around trying to do something, when really all we can do is wait. We are like the disciples waiting in the upper room, the women waiting in the cold hours before dawn. But we must not fear, because the God Who has taken us through years of life will not abandon us now. Why? Resurrection power is at work in our lives just because Jesus Christ was raised from the dead. He is faithful. His perfect love casts out fear. So in facing extraordinary circumstances, we don't need to fear. The Son of God defeated all the sin and sorrow, all illness and death, the devil and even hell itself. Then He came back to life to prove it. The tomb is empty. Don't be afraid.
